Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) & Doctoral Degree (Ed.D.) Teacher Leadership For Learning Concentration: Instructional Technology (ITEC)

The focus of the Ed.S. and Ed.D. Instructional Technology concentration is to deepen and broaden the knowledge and skills of candidates in the area of Instructional Technology. The Instructional Technology concentration prepares elementary, middle and secondary teachers to be leaders in the use of technology for standards-based instruction and assessment. Instructional Technology emerges from the concept of teacher leadership as its primary emphasis is to support the development of teachers in their efforts to use emerging technologies to increase student achievement. The program of study will prepare teachers to model best practices in the use of instructional technologies and to provide high-quality professional learning experiences for other educators. This course of study is designed to meet the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GPSC) standards for receipt of a T -6 (EdS) and a T-7 (EdD) certificate.
